• A report from *College Measures* entitled, <u>Higher Education Pays: The Initial</u> <u>Earnings of Graduates of Texas Public Colleges and Universities</u>, discusses the research conducted that examined the first-year salaries of graduates of two- and four-year institutions who work in Texas. Among their findings: students with two-year technical degrees have first-year salaries of \$50,000-\$11,000 more than graduates of bachelor degree programs and \$30,000 more than students with two-year academic degrees causing the authors to conclude that meeting immediate workforce need, technical certificate holders' first-year earnings can exceed those who hold academic and technical associate's degrees.
