Leadership Resources:

- · Illinois Principal Preparation Reform Highlighted At NCSL National Conference The following is the PowerPoint and materials from the NCSL Leadership Summit that featured the work of Illinois around principal preparation redesign.
- State Principal Data Guide This report from the Center for Reinventing Public Education (CRPE) discusses why principals are essential to so many of today's education efforts and why it is important to take action now. The report's Principal Pipeline Framework can help states prioritize and adopt an array of policies to attract and make the most of strong principal talent to support the needs identified in the data.

- Selecting Growth Models for School and Teacher Evaluations: This <u>paper</u> outlines three approaches to utilizing a growth model for evaluating schools and teachers.
- The Strike over Student 'Growth': Chicago Teachers' Protest Reflects a National Feud Striking teachers in Chicago are fighting a controversial education reform that could overhaul how teachers are paid and evaluated, placing emphasis on the difficulty of judging teachers by student performance. According to National Center for Teacher Quality data, new evaluation systems have been changed in at least 33 states since 2009 and more than two dozen states are depending on observations and student test scores. - **Report Backs Evaluating Teachers on Test Scores** Linking teacher job evaluations to student achievement, which is starting in Louisiana this year, is an indicator of how effective teachers will be in the future, according to a Manhattan Institute <u>report</u>. - Report: Calif. Needs to Revamp Teaching Profession A California task force <u>report</u> said the state has focused too heavily on holding teachers accountable for test scores without properly equipping them. The task force makes suggestions on what teacher evaluations should include, and how to address the issue of teacher evaluation. (*San Jose Mercury News*, 09/10/12)

- Transforming Tenure: Using Value-Added Modeling to Identify Ineffective Teachers This report analyzes data from Florida public schools to show that a Value Added Model (VAM) score in a teacher's third year is a good predictor of that teacher's success in his or her fifth year. This paper also addresses the most effective ways that VAM can be used in tenure reform.
- Principals' Associations Report: Evaluations Should Be Multifaceted According to a <u>new report</u> by two principal organizations, principal evaluation should be multifaceted and growth-oriented rather than punitive and reliant on standardized test scores. The report addresses the current state of principal evaluation and suggests that principals should be evaluated based on six domains. (*Education Week*, edweek.org, 09/13/12)

Teacher Preparation:

- State May Rank Iowa Teacher Colleges, Graduates' Performance Ranking Iowa's teacher colleges and tracking the performance of their graduates are some of the ideas being considered by the state's board of education. The potential changes are part of a larger effort to overhaul the accreditation process for teacher preparation programs. (*Des Moines Register*, 09/14/12)

- The Work of Teaching and the Challenge for Teacher Education- Presentation by Deborah Loewenberg Deborah Loewenberg Ball will speak on Tuesday, October 30, 2012 from 10:30-12:00 p.m. at the University of Illinois at Chicago. She currently serves as Dean of the School of Education. Her presentation will explain how effective teacher training is based on:
 - · *High-leverage teaching practice*: Curriculum focused on the highest leverage instructional practices and the specialized knowledge of the academic domain that teachers are expected to teach.
 - · Close practice and feedback in clinical settings so that teachers can be deliberately taught and explicitly coached with the skills to reach a range of learners.
 - · Rigorous exit requirements: Highly credible and predictive professional assessments of knowledge and skill so that no one enters the classroom without demonstrated capacity for effective performance for a beginner teacher.

Early Learning:

- Study Finds U.S. Trailing in Preschool Enrollment The United States lags behind most of the world's leading economies when it comes to providing early-childhood education opportunities to young children, according to an OECD study. This report states that the United States ranks 28th out of 38 countries for the share of 4-year-olds enrolled in pre-primary education programs, and discussing the investment of the U.S. in early childhood education.
