MESSAGE FROM THE DEAN



As the new dean of the College of Education, I am honored to become part of the great legacy of educator preparation at Illinois State University. I spent the last 16 years at DePaul University, and this is one of the few schools

that could have enticed me to leave. Now that I have had the chance to meet and work with some of the College of Education's remarkable faculty, staff, and students, I know coming to Illinois State University was the right choice. Every day I meet someone intriguing, take up a new opportunity, and discover a new aspect of this exceptional college. In short, this college teaches me something new every day, and there is no higher praise for a college than that. As you read through this report, you will see how strong the College of Education is, and why I am truly honored to be here.

With an alumni base of more than 60,000 educators throughout all 50 U.S. states and in 68 countries worldwide, Illinois State is a leader in the field of education. Within Illinois alone, almost one in six teachers is an alum of the University.

With teacher shortages prevalent throughout the country, we continue to work tirelessly to deliver the highest quality educator and administrator preparation programs to our students. Our recruitment efforts have provided steady enrollment levels, and Illinois State continues to be the largest preparer of future teachers in the Midwest. In fact, total enrollment in the college rose nearly 5 percent last year from the previous year.

Graduate programs continue to be a point of emphasis in the college, and our progress has gained national recognition. Illinois State University climbed 12 spots in the *U.S. News & World Report* rankings for 2019 Best Graduate Schools in Education, coming in at 108th this year. With the strength of our faculty, staff, and students, I have no doubt our rankings will continue to rise. Additionally, enrollment in these programs remained steady with 615 students in 2018.

According to data from the Partnership for Educator Preparation (PEP) and the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE), our graduates enter the field well prepared and are overwhelmingly recognized as high quality educators. The college has a strong relationship with ISBE and will continue to work closely with ISBE on recommendations from the Illinois Teach Report to drive the direction of teacher education over the next 10 years.






Graduate enrollment



College of Education alumni satisfaction indicators, Illinois State Exit Survey, *Skyfactor* (out of 7).




College of Education enrollment

Using new PEP data from ISBE

Starting in 2016, ISBE began efforts to enhance the data for educator preparation. Through PEP a new system was developed and is being used as a tool for continuous improvement to strengthen teacher preparation statewide.
