What is the EDI?

- Population measure
 - OCommunity Needs Assessment
 - \circ Precise Data
 - **OKindergarten Census**

Survey of 103 questions- Presented as Maps/Tables

 Measures five developmental domains - holistic
 Completed by Kindergarten teachers
 Typically administered triennially second half of year

The Early Development Instrument




The EDI Does Not:

- Report on individual children
- Identify specific learning disabilities
- Recommend special education or being held back
- Recommend teaching approaches/inform instruction
- Reflect performance of school or quality of teaching


