MS Degree in College Student Personnel Administration

The Master's Degree in College Student Personnel Administration (CSPA) concentration trains candidates to succeed in entry- to mid-level student affairs positions in two-year and four-year public and private colleges and universities. Graduates will be qualified to serve as administrators, advisors, and programmers in areas as diverse as residential life, activities, admissions, advising, service and leadership, orientation, multicultural programs, student conduct, fraternity and sorority life, and assessment. Coursework includes classes where students will learn student development theory, different types of offices and institutions, the law as it relates to college students, and counseling college students.



Program Features

higher education and student services, as well as effective management of personnel, resources, and facilities.

- Assistantship opportunities available both years that come with tuition waivers and a monthly stipend.
- Cohort size limited to 25 students per year.
