General Outline

The Master's Degree in College Student Personnel Administration (CSPA) concentration trains candidates to succeed in entry- to mid-level student affairs positions in two-year and four-year public and private colleges and universities. Graduates will be qualified to serve as administrators, advisors, and programmers in areas as diverse as residential life, activities, admissions, advising, service and leadership, orientation, multicultural programs, student conduct, fraternity and sorority life, and assessment. Coursework includes classes in student development theory, the law as it relates to college students, and counseling college students.

Program Features

- Full-time or part-time enrollment options available.
- Comprehensive training through classes and practical experiences.
- Emphasis on managing personnel, resources, and students.



Curriculum

- 42 credit hours of course work with a capstone seminar (Full-time)
- 36 credit hours of course work plus a comprehensive examination (Part-time)
- 36 credit hours of course work plus a thesis (Parttime)

Admissions Requirements



- Preferred application deadline for consideration in Fall 2026 is Friday, January 3.
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
 - Current resume, personal statement, and two letters of reference.
- Submit up to a 750-word statement that describes your career objectives.
