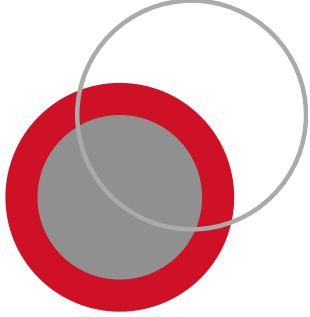

- Apply for scholarships offered by Department of Educational Administration and Foundations scholarships by April 1 at **Education.IllinoisState.edu/Scholarships**

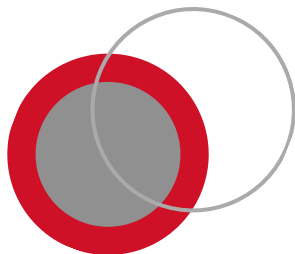
Format

- 100% Online
- Synchronous classes taught over Zoom
- Courses are completed in 3 years
- 51 credit hours of course work and 15 hours of dissertation hours
- Two courses per semester (fall, spring, & summer)
- Compacted course format during the summer
- Fall & spring courses are Wednesdays: 4:00-6:50pm & 7:00-9:50pm

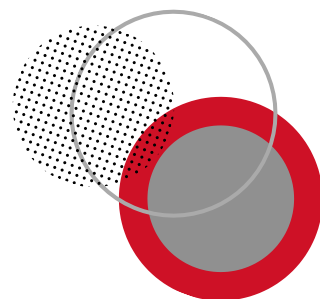
Qualifications

- c. ability to conduct academic research independently
