Qualifications

The P-12 Ed.D. is designed for school leaders who have:

Demonstrated at least two years of effectiveness as a building or central office administrator/leader.

Strong academic credentials and an interest in conducting scholarly research on a problem of practice.

Requirements

The program requires 60 hours of course work beyond a masters degree followed by 15 hours of dissertation research.

Doctoral residency requirements are fulfilled during the program.

Completion of the comprehensive exam will require a successful TED Talk and written research summary.

Program must be completed in 8 years.

Cost

The current in-state tuition cost for a 3-credit course is \$1,457.61.
