
State Tax Appropriations to Higher Education, Fiscal Year 2001



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Introduction

The *Grapevine* project, begun in 1958 by M. M. Chambers, entails an annual survey of state higher education and government officials. The intent is to record annual tax appropriations for the operating expenses of higher education, noting percentage changes from year to year. As such, the *Grapevine* data are indicators of state tax effort in support of higher education.

This two-part report details findings for fiscal year 2001 (FY01). Part I provides a summary analysis, including:

- 1-, 2-, 5- and 10-year percentage increases in state tax appropriations;
- a brief examination of regional variations;
- data comparing percentage changes in state tax appropriations to higher education ("effort")
 with percentage changes in total state general fund monies available ("capacity") and total
 state appropriations ("willingness"); and
- data indexing state tax support of higher education to population and personal income.

Part II provides detailed tables outlining FY01 tax appropriations for higher education in each of the 50 states. These tables also include revised tax appropriations data for fiscal year 2000 (FY00).


Part I: National Overview

The 50 states appropriated a total of \$60.6 billion in tax monies for the general operating expenses of higher education in FY01. An overall look at these tax appropriations (**Table 1**, p. 8) shows how widely the states vary in terms of the magnitude of their higher education systems. At one end of the spectrum is California with its \$9 billion appropriation to higher education (15% of the total state tax dollars appropriated nationwide). Vermont stands at the other end with an appropriation of \$67.8 million. The median among the states was approximately \$880 million.

Most of the \$60.6 billion appropriated nationwide (78%) can be accounted for by the 22 states that appropriated \$1 billion dollars or more to higher education, and just over 50% of the national total was accounted for by the nine "megastates:" California, Florida, Illinois, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, and Texas. Because of their relative size and their influence in the political economy of the nation, these "megastates" are marked with an asterisk in tables throughout the report.

Tax Appropriations to Higher Education: Percentage Changes from Previous Years

The FY01 total appropriation figure of \$60.6 billion represented a 7% increase over FY00. Continuing an upward trend that began after the recession of the early 1990s (**Figure 1**, below), this is the fourth year in a row that the aggregate state tax appropriations to higher education nationwide have increased by a rate ranging between 6% and 7%. 


The aggregate data, however, mask considerable variations by state (**Figure 2**, next page). One-year percentage changes from FY00 to FY01 ranged from -1.0% in Hawaii and Texas to 17.0% in

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¹ As Hines [1998, p. 6] notes, the term "megastate" was "coined by Neal Pierce in his description of the major American states...[that] have relatively large populations, well developed industrial and business bases, and large higher education systems." Prior to fiscal year 1998, *Grapevine* applied the term to those states appropriating \$1 billion or more to the general operation of higher education. However, at the suggestion of the State Higher Education Executive Officers, "*Grapevine* redefined 'megastates' as those states that collectively appropriate one-half of the national total of state support to higher education" (Hines, 1998, p.6)

California. The median percentage change among the states was 5.5%; 25 states registered a change of 5.5% or less, and 25 states registered a change of 5.6% or greater (**Table 3**, p. 10). The "megastates" accounted for 60% of the change from FY00 to FY01, reflecting California's relatively large increase. When California data are not figured into the equation, the aggregate percentage change in tax appropriations nationwide between FY00 and FY01 is only 5%.²



Additional variations between states emerge in comparisons of FY01 data with appropriations figures for FY99 (2 years ago), FY96 (5 years ago), and FY91 (10 years ago). Overall, the \$60.6 billion figure for FY01 represents a 14.4% increase over FY98, a 36.5% increase over FY96, and a 51.9% increase over FY91 (**Table 3**, p. 10). But some states have clearly fared better in the long run than others. This can be seen by ranking the states according to their two-year, five-year, and ten-year percentage changes (**Table 4**, p. 11). Eleven states—CA, DE, FL, KS, KY, MA, MI, MS, NE, OH, OR—rank in the top 50% in all three categories. In contrast AL, AZ, CO, HI, IA, MN, MT, NH, NY, ND, SD, TN, WV, and WY ranked in the bottom half of the states in all three categories. The rankings for the remaining 25 states were mixed, showing variations in longer-term or shorter-term gains.

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² Comparisons between states in terms of one-year changes in tax appropriations are problematic because of varying state budget cycles. For example, FY01 is the second year of the biennial budgets in Oregon and Texas. The relatively low percentage changes registered for these states may be an artifact their budgeting cycles.


Regional Variations in One-Year Percentage Changes, FY00-FY01

Figure 3 illustrates regional variations among the states, ordering them by tax-effort *quartiles* and by geographical *quadrants*. The quartiles refer to state rankings in terms of one-year changes in state tax appropriations to higher education between FY00 and FY01. The quadrants refer to four large geographical areas. As for geographic quadrants, the Mississippi River divides east from west. In the east, the Ohio River and the southern Pennsylvania border divide north from south; in the west, the northern borders of Missouri, Kansas, Colorado, Utah, Nevada, and California for a dividing line. Alaska is in the northwest group; Hawaii is in the southwest group.

A mixed pattern emerges. In each geographic quadrant, states distribute themselves across the four tax-effort quartiles. Nonetheless, the east appears to have an edge over the west. Ten of the 14 northeastern states were in the top two quartiles, as were 8 of the 12 southeastern states. In contrast, five of the 11 northwestern states were in the top two quartiles. In the southwest, only 2 of 13 states were in the top two quartiles.

"Capacity," "Willingness," and "Effort"

The data in the **Table 5** (p.12) contrast state "effort" in higher education funding (as measured by percentage increases in tax appropriations to higher education institutions) with

- (a) state "capacity," as measured by the percentage increase expected in each state's general revenue fund; and
- (b) legislator "willingness," as measured by the projected increase in each state's total appropriations.

These measures of capacity and willingness, based on state general fund budget estimates calculated by the National Association of State Budget Officers (2000)³, put the Grapevine data within the context of two fundamental questions: "Do the states have the wherewithal to fund higher education at present levels of support?" and "To what extent are lawmakers willing to fund higher education in the face of other competing demands made on the state treasury?"




Figure 4: Distribution of States According to the Relationship of Percent Changes in "Effort" to Percent Changes in "Capacity" and "Willingness"

Results, illustrated visually in **Figure 4**, show a mixed picture between states. Data for the one-year period between FY00 and FY01 show that in 17 states, changes in effort exceeded percentage

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³ Texas is the only exception. The National Association of State Budget Officers (2000), citing Texas's biennial budgeting system, does not provide projected FY01 revenue and expenditure data for that state. Thus we used Texas data provided by the National Conference of State Legislators (Personal communication to Sandra L. Gillilan, February 01, 2001).

changes in both capacity and willingness; this was the case for 19 states when looking at the twoyear change between FY '99 and FY '01. In a smaller number of states (11 and 14, respectively), percentage changes in effort were smaller than percentage changes in both capacity and willingness. In other states, percentage changes in effort exceeded either percentage changes in capacity or percentage changes in willingness.

These variations support Hines's (1998, p. 8) observation that revenue capacity is "not a large factor" in whether a state makes relatively more or less effort for higher education. Data in **Table 6** (p.13) add further evidence for this hypothesis, comparing changes in capacity and willingness for (a) the ten states that registered the largest one-year percentage changes in state tax appropriations and (b) the ten states that registered the smallest one-year percentage changes. Though the average change in capacity among the top ten states was only 1.5%, the average change in effort was 10.4%. In bottom ten states, the average change in capacity was 3.8%, but the average change in effort was 1%.

Tax Appropriations Indexed to Population and Personal Income

Further variations between states can be seen when tax allocations for higher education are indexed per capita and per \$1,000 in personal income. As data in **Table 7** (p.14) reveal, Mississippi and New Hampshire were at the top and bottom, respectively, for both measures. Mississippi's allocation of \$14.86 per \$1,000 in personal income in FY01 was approximately six times larger than the \$2.45 per \$1,000 allocated in New Hampshire; the median among the states was \$7.57. The range between the states was narrower for per-capita data. Mississippi allocated \$313.15 per capita for higher education while New Hampshire allocated \$80.63; the median among the 50 states was \$220.54.

Examined over the past ten years (**Table 8**, p. 15), the data relating tax allocations to personal income and population reveal a mixed trend: although the median per-capita figure among states for higher education tax allocations has increased by approximately 38% since FY91, the median dollar amount allocated per \$1,000 of personal income has *decreased* by approximately 25%. Higher education clearly faces ever-stiffer competition in state economies.

Conclusion

The overall *Grapevine* results for FY '01 reveal a continuation of the modest increases in tax effort registered since the nation's recovery from the recession of the early 1990s. Variations between states, however, may portend a weakening of this trend in what some commentators in 2000 called a "wait-and-see economy" that should be viewed with "cautious optimism" (American Association of State Colleges and Universities, 2000, p.1; McKeown-Moak, 2000, p. 19). Although almost all states reported gains in tax appropriations to higher education, most fell far below California's anomalous 17% increase, and in comparison to the FY '00 Grapevine reports, fewer states in FY01 reported one-year and two-year gains that were greater than the gains in the preceding year (**Table 9**, p. 15).

All indications at the beginning of 2001 suggest that tax appropriations to higher education will continue to change at a level or declining pace. The National Conference of State Legislatures (2001) reports a generally positive outlook for the remainder of FY 2001, but notes that some states are "more guarded [than others], ... citing concerns about the strength of the economy." Subsequent reports in the *Chronicle of Higher Education* highlight legislator caution in the face of

these concerns and predict heightened competition for state tax dollars from the schools, health care agencies, and other publicly funded programs (Hebel, Schmidt, & Selingo, 2001; Schmidt, 2001a, 2001b). The FY '01 Grapevine data may have marked the end of the roaring 90s for higher education and the beginning of a more tenuous era.

Part II: State-by-State Appropriations

The Nature of the Data

The individual state tables in this section reflect decisions made by legislatures in the 50 states about the amount of state tax to be appropriated in FY01 for operating expenses of colleges and universities.

State tax appropriations are a major source of revenue and are the focus of this report (local taxes, federal funds, and student tuition are excluded). These data sometimes are referred to as *total state tax effort* for higher education. Thus, funds are included if legislatures made appropriations to higher education using state taxes as the revenue source.

These figures include not only campus operating funds, but also funds for state scholarship programs, even if the funds go to students attending private or independent institutions. The figures also include funds to private or independent colleges and universities if appropriated from state tax funds; to statewide coordinating and governing boards; and to state agencies. The next section includes the specific instructions sent to each state for the purpose of clarifying data collection and reporting.

In addition to these definitions, exclusions, and caveats, it must be recognized that some states have unique budgeting and accounting practices, meaning that these data can only begin to approach comparability. These data, however, are timely because they are published as soon as possible after legislative decisions are made. They are accurate because they include revisions, and they are comprehensive because they reflect the total amount of state taxes either appropriated or destined for the operations of colleges and universities.

Data Revisions

By law, states may not go into deficit spending, which means that states must stay within budgets built on existing taxation systems and revenue projects. As revenue flow changes, forecasts are updated. These revenue forecasts and the flow of revenue control a state's ability to appropriate general fund revenue dollars to areas of spending, including higher education. In addition, because higher education is an area of discretionary spending for state government, targeted higher education dollars may be diverted to cover other areas of need. In such cases, supplemental appropriations may be made when and if the revenue flow provides sufficient resources to provide additional dollars to an area such as higher education. This

phenomenon has caused many states to make supplemental decisions for higher education appropriations after the initial decision during the legislative cycle, which results in revisions to our original data set for the previous year. These revisions are indicated by "(R)" in the previous fiscal year data.

Data revisions published in this year's report will change the data reported by the states in previous reports. Researchers are advised, therefore, to use the most recent data available in order to incorporate revisions to data previously reported.

What the Figures Are Intended to Mean

Listed below are the specific instructions sent to each state for the purpose of clarifying data collection and reporting. Different practices among the 50 states make it impossible to eliminate all inconsistencies and to ensure absolute comparability among states and institutions. We emphasize that comparisons are useful only if the data are correctly interpreted.

- 1. Report only appropriations, not actual expenditures.
- Report only sums appropriated for annual operating expenses.
- 3. For state tax appropriations in complex universities, set out separately the sums appropriated for (or allocated to) the main campuses, branch campuses, and medical centers (even if on the main campus). The medical center item should be include operation of colleges of medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, nursing, and teaching hospitals, either lumped as one sum or set out separately as preferred.

4. Include:

- Sums appropriated for state aid to local public community colleges and for operation of statesupported community colleges, and for vocation-technical two-year colleges or institutes that are predominantly for high school graduates and adult students.
- Sums appropriated to statewide coordinating boards or governing boards, either for board expenses or for allocation by the board to other institutions or both.

- Sums appropriated for state scholarships or other student financial aid.
- Sums destined for higher education but appropriated to some other state agency. Examples: funds intended for faculty fringe benefits may be appropriated to the state treasurer and disbursed by that office; certain funds for medical and health education may be appropriated to the state department of health and disbursed from that department. Sometimes these sums have to be estimated because the exact amount disbursed cannot be known until after the end of the fiscal period.
- Appropriations directed to private institutions of higher education at all levels.

5. Exclude:

- Appropriations for capital outlays and debt service.
- Appropriations of sums derived from federal sources, student fees, auxiliary enterprises and other non-tax sources.
