GRAPEVINE INFORMATION

Grapevine reports on total state effort for higher education, including tax appropriations for universities, colleges, community colleges, and state higher education agencies. In this WWW site are individual reports from the 50 states which include current fiscal year and previous fiscal year state tax appropriations for operating expenses of higher education.

These reports are entered as they are received from the states during the period from March through September of the calendar year. For the most current state report which incorporates revisions to the initial decisions made by state legislatures, refer to *State Appropriations for Higher Education* (year), which is published annually in March and can be purchased from the State Higher Education Executive Officers, Denver, Colorado.

Also contained in the SHEEO volume are comparative measures of per capita appropriations, appropriations per \$1000 of personal income, consolidated systems of higher education, multi-campus universities, community colleges, and local tax appropriations (used primarily for community colleges). Local taxes were collected beginning in FY 95 and are included in this volume.

For the first time this year, there will be a table showing state rankings on per capita and per \$1000 of personal income measures, using state and local tax funds. Historical data going back to 1960 may be purchased from:
