*The Illinois Board of Higher Education has notified Grapevine and the State Higher Education Executive Officers (SHEEO) group that it is reviewing and revising both the enrollment and financial data previously submitted to Grapevine and SHEEO's State Higher Education Finance (SHEF) project. All of this is being done to more accurately reflect state fiscal support for higher education in Illinois. Revised Illinois data, along with explanations for those revisions, will be posted in next year's Grapevine report, which will appear in January 2018. Until then, Illinois data have been removed from the Grapevine tables. We look forward to working with the IBHE as it reviews its data reporting process.
