Jepsen International Scholars Program

The Jepsen International Scholars Program, funded generously by Dr. Keith Jepsen and Ms. Kathy Dore, will assist students with financial need to involve themselves in a diverse culture and language in its natural setting. Study Abroad programs that emphasize learning a different language and culture are the preferred focus for the Jepsen Scholars Program.

Eligibility:

Each candidate for the Jepson International Scholars Program must:

- Be a College of Education student major (programs in TCH, SED, EAF)
 - Undergraduate majors: Early Childhood Education, Elementary Education, Bilingual/Bicultural Elementary Education, Middle Level Education, SED DHH, SED LBS1, SED LVB
 - Graduate majors: One of the majors listed on the <u>COE website</u>.
- Be a U.S. citizen
- Be participating in the international travel education experiences (courses) sponsored and developed by the College of Education.
 - Preference given to students who will be studying in countries where English is not the primary spoken language.
- Demonstrate financial need
- Agree to share your experiences with the donors via email while the experience is occurring, and after you graduate and begin to teach fulltime
- Agree to write an article for the College of Education website sharing their study abroad experiences
