

**Illinois State University  
2025 Lab School Asbestos Annual Update  
Thomas Metcalf School, Fairchild Hall, and University High School**

Pursuant to the Local Education Authority requirements of the Asbestos Abatement Act 855.300 (a) (3), Illinois State University's Environmental Health and Safety (EHS), with assistance from an independent, licensed, third-party consultant, conducted asbestos surveys of all lab schools operated by the University. As required by the Act, the periodic surveys are conducted twice per year, and a comprehensive inspection of all three lab schools is conducted every 3 years. All response actions, operations, and maintenance work, and clean-up work that involves asbestos containing material is completed with oversight and supervision of EHS. All work is conducted by properly licensed individuals and/or contractors in accordance with all applicable State and Federal asbestos regulations. A third-party Asbestos Project Manager/Air Sampling Professional is also on site during the entirety of all abatement projects, defined as any friable asbestos removal greater than 3 square or 3 lineal feet.

The following asbestos abatement projects(greater than 3 square feet or 3 lineal feet of friable asbestos) were completed in 2025:

- May-June 2025, University High School-Removal of asbestos pipe insulation, floor tile/mastic and other misc. asbestos materials from the main office suite(room 229) and the chemistry classroom/lab(room 315) as part of a planned renovation project.

The following small scale (less than 3 square/3 lineal feet of friable asbestos) operations and maintenance work involving asbestos was performed in 2025 by the University Asbestos Abatement Team, supervised by EHS:

- August 24, 2025 Metcalf Elementary-Removal of pipe insulation in the rooftop mechanical room for an equipment upgrade project.

Every K-12 school in Illinois is required by the Asbestos Abatement Act 855.325 to maintain an Asbestos Management Plan. The Management plan is a comprehensive report and history that identifies asbestos containing surfaces and materials. The plan includes inspection reports, sample results, response actions and an operations and maintenance program. The Management Plans for each school were revised and updated in 2025 and are available in the main office of each school. The Management Plans are available for review during normal office hours without cost or restriction for representatives of the EPA, the State, and the public.
