Program Format

Courses first three years (fall, spring, and summer semesters)

Independent studies include professional practices in college teaching and research

15 hours of elective coursework in an area of interest

Comprehensive examination and dissertation during remaining years

Program Requirements

Doctoral candidates must complete a minimum of 75 credit hours including:

23 hours of core coursework

37 hours of specialized coursework (includes 15 hours of electives)

15 hours of dissertation coursework
